Course Outline:

This course is an introduction to the Spanish language. It is taught through the skills of listening, reading, writing, and speaking. Students will learn to understand the Spanish language as it is spoken at a basic level and to communicate with simple verbal or written responses. Spanish sounds will be learned through imitation. Basic grammar and sentence structure will be taught in basic, everyday vocabulary. Basic cultural themes of the Spanish-speaking world will be introduced and interspersed through the course.

Students who successfully complete the 3 semesters of Spanish during seventh and eighth grades and pass the Exit Exam will receive high school credit for Spanish I and advance to Spanish II in high school.

Grades:

Minor Assessment (Mastery Checks/ Quizzes/ Classwork):

Minor assessments include quizzes, class work and other mastery checks. Students can expect two to four minor assessment each week.

Major Assessments:

Major assessments include tests, projects and other cumulative assignments. Students can expect at least two to three major assessments each quarter.

Skills Assessments (Reading, Writing, Speaking, Listening):

Students will be assessed periodically on their ability to understand and present information in Spanish. These assessments may or may not be announced.

Homework:

Practice is critical in the mastery of Spanish and students should expect to have 20 minutes of homework nightly. Although homework is not calculated into the overall grade, it will be checked daily.

Quiz Retakes:

Retakes will be offered for students that did not earn at least an 80% originally. Quiz corrections and 20 minutes of study time will have to be logged before a retake will be given. Retakes will be done in SMART Block and need to be completed before taking the unit test.

** If you have any missing homework/ practice assignments, you will not be eligible to retake.

Policy on the use of translation aids

Rationale: Students are expected to communicate in Spanish without the use of translating aids.

The following are considered translating aids:

- Computer websites/ programs
- Translators/ excessive use of a dictionary
- Persons who speak Spanish (native speakers)



The use of any of the above to complete assignments given to students defeats the goals outlined in the Wake County Public School Systems Spanish Benchmarks.

Students who violate the intent of the goals described above will receive a "0" for the assignment. In addition, the incident may be reported to an administrator on a discipline referral citing insubordination and cheating.

The authenticity of a student's work may be challenged when it demonstrates one or more of the following:

- Vocabulary beyond the scope of what has been taught
- Use of verb tenses beyond the scope of what has been taught
- Erroneous word order
- Other indicators of fraudulent work
